NATIONAL DEWORMING DAY

The main aim of the De-worming Day is to raise awareness on intestinal worms and to attain complete eradication of Soil-Transmitted Helminths(STH) in children. Around 24% of the world's population is infected with soil-transmitted helminths (worms). Keeping in mind the importance of health, the government has taken an initiative to make every child worm-free in the country. Hence, National Deworming Day (NDD) has been celebrated every year on February 10 with the purpose to curb intestinal worm infections in the children between the age group of 1-19 years. This significant step by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare has raised awareness regarding the health of the children in their parents and guardians.

According to the guidelines of the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, A. P. Vijayawada, GDC, Yerraguntla, Kadapa district has conducted the programme on 3rd March 2022 with the assistance of the health workers of the concerned PHC by following civid-19 precautionary measures.

The Principal and Staff monitored the programme, Albendazol 400mg tablets were distributed to 120 under graduate students who are under 19 years age, in order to deworm and improve their overall health, nutritional status, access to education and quality of life.

The Principal and the staff have spoken about the importance and purposes of conducting the National Deworming Day, to promote the awareness of Intestinal worms and the effect of these parasites that live in the human body; they consume important nutrients from the human body that leads to poor nutrition levels, blood loss and stunted growth in people. It can also result in children developing anaemia, malnutrition and impaired cognitive, mental and physical development. The speakers advised the students to prevent the intestinal worms, they should improve their sanitation and hygiene; washing hands regularly and properly, drinking clean and safe water, washing vegetables and fruits in clean water before using them and keeping nails short and clean always.

He also emphasized the importance of achieving the goals of the college by giving impetus to women's empowerment. World Consumer Rights Day

World Consumer Rights day is celebrated on 15 March 2022 every year with an aim to encourage awareness about consumer rights and needs across the world. The day also aims to safeguard consumer rights and to ensure that customers are not subjected to market exploitation or social injustice that may imperil their rights. India has enshrined the concept of consumer rights in its Constitution. The Consumer Protection Act was passed in Parliament in December 1986, with the goal of empowering consumers.

The Department of Commerce has organized the World Consumer Rights Day. The Principal has memorised the historical background of the day; On 15 March 1962, then US President John F Kennedy delivered a special message to the US Congress and addressed the issue of consumer rights. Kennedy became the first world leader to highlight the importance of this issue.





Ch. Ramakrishna, Lecturer in Commerce has shared the information on Consumer Protection Act and its amendments. He elaborately discussed on the Consumer Protection Act 2019, which states that every complaint shall be disposed of as expeditiously as possible and endeavour shall be made to decide the complaint within a period of three months from the date of receipt of notice by opposite party where the complaint does not require. He mentioned about the empowerment of the District Council, State Council and National Council for consumer redressal mechanisms to protect consumer rights.

K.R. Bhagavathi, Lecturer in Commerce stressed on the theme for World Consumer Rights Day 2022 is "Fair Digital Finance". The reason behind deciding on this idea is to achieve a transparent and fair system when it comes to dealing with digital financial services; e-payments. It aims to encourage people to create insights and campaigns which are consumer-centered as well as inclusive, data protected, safe & private, and sustainable. She also expressed about the cyber fraud issues in south-East Asia, as one out three people are facing the cyber hoaxes. All the staff members and the students enthusiastically participated in the programme and expressed their views and shared their experiences with much ease and attention.

The eventual damage to the economy significantly appears in the sectors like Food & Agriculture, Aviation & Tourism, Telecom, Medical, Oil and Gas etc. The sudden shrinkage in demand & increased unemployment is going to alter the business landscape.

He also discussed the sustainable recovery measures for this situation by adopting new principles like 'shift towards localization, cash conservation, supply chain resilience and innovation'.
